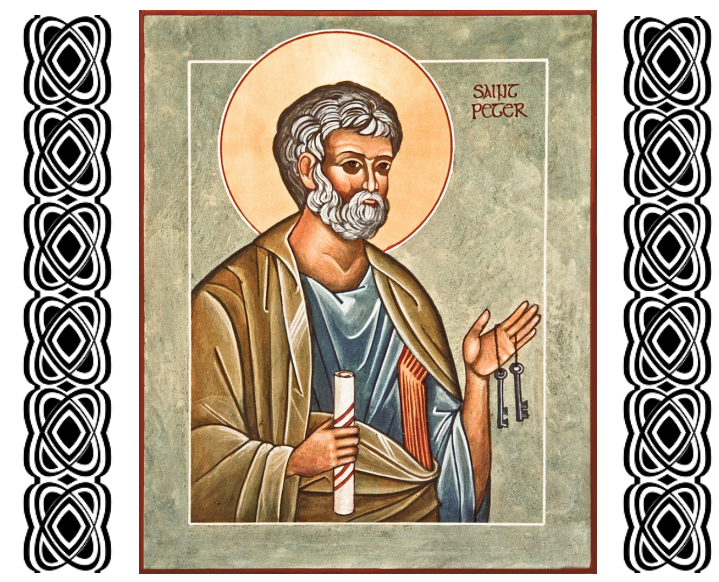

**PARISH COUNCIL**-There will be a Parish Pastoral Council meeting Thursday, March 16 at 7PM in the Annex.

**THE PRO-LIFE ROSARY** will be recited after the 7:00 Mass on Thursday, March 16. We invite anyone who would like to pray for an end to abortion to join us.

**CONGRATULATIONS** to Mauricio Jose' Rosales, son of Santos and Yarleni Rosales, who will join our parish family this weekend through Baptism. May God bless him and his family.

**GRIEF MINISTRY**-We are establishing a Grief Ministry reaching out to those who have experienced the loss of loved ones and friends. Mark Komula has agreed to serve as coordinator. **THE DIACONATE** is an important church ministry. The deacon has an important role in the parish and in liturgy. **LITURGICAL REFLECTION...**Lent possesses a penitential nature as believers are invited to fast, pray and give alms. Lent also possesses a baptismal character in which believers renew their identity in Christ during the forty days. As the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy states, by baptism all are plunged into the paschal mystery of Christ: they die with him, are buried with him, and rise with him. The forty days of Lent give all believers time to reflect on the meaning of their baptismal identity. On Easter all Catholics will stand and renew their baptismal promises. Lent is a serious season to reflect and recommit as disciples of Jesus Christ.

**THE CUP AND THE SHAKING OF HANDS**-Many people are suffering from colds and influenza. Caution must be taken to reduce the spread of disease. Therefore: The use of the communion cup at all Masses will be suspended until the threat of disease passes. Another major mode of disease transmission is hand shaking. Therefore: I ask your cooperation in not shaking hands with others at the Peace Rite until the disease threat is diminished.
