PASTOR'S COMMENTS**

\* Today is Mother's Day, a day we recognize the great contributions of some very special people in our lives. Today we recognize the mothers, grandmothers, godmothers & foster mothers of our parish & beyond! Thank you for your love, concern & generosity! May God bless & sustain you on your special day and everyday! (Mass intentions for today are for the Mothers of our parish, living & deceased.)

\* We've entered the time when air conditioning may be used in the church for weekend Masses. The system will be set at 70°. Please bring a sweater or jacket if you find 70° uncomfortable. The system may be on at the 8AM Sunday Mass even if the outside temperature is cool. This is necessary so that the church might be comfortable for later Masses.

\* Compact discs on many important spiritual topics are available on a rack in the vestibule. The CDs are insightful and practical. Proceeds from the sale of CDs are given to the Outreach Committee to help those who are struggling financially in our area. Take advantage of this opportunity to listen and learn.


\* It is a sad reality that sometimes funeral Masses are poorly attended. Sometimes the decedent has outlived family and friends; sometimes not widely known. The Corporal Works of Mercy stress burying the dead. Attending funeral Masses in solidarity with the family and friends of the decedent is praiseworthy and a Corporal work of Mercy, even if you are not familiar with the decedent.

\* Two areas of parish life that have been a great concern of mine because we have not responded to real need are youth ministry and grief support ministry. A vibrant parish should be strong in these areas. We are in the process of beginning ministries in these two very important areas.


Kelsey Orange will be Youth Group Moderator. She has positive experience in youth ministry. Her age and rapport allow her to relate very effectively to young people. We hope to initiate group activities in June. Volunteers will be needed to staff the program. A parent advisory board will be established. More details will be upcoming.

Mark Komula will be the Grief Support Ministry Program Moderator. The death of a loved one or friend often has a devastating impact. People are hurting in the face of loss. Our parish has a duty to reach out to those in our parish family who are grieving in order to offer presence, concern and prayerful support. This program is in formation after a very positive and well attended initial meeting. Perhaps you have the gift of compassion and empathy to participate in this very important ministry.
