FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER  
PASTOR'S COMMENTS**

\* The feast day of Saint Peregrine Laziosi, patron saint of cancer victims, is May 1. A prayer service honoring St. Peregrine and prayerfully supporting cancer victims and their families will take place on Sunday, May 6 at 7PM. This prayer service will have great personal meaning to me in light of my multiple myeloma. Many of our parish families have been impacted by cancer. This is an opportunity for parishioners to show solidarity with those impacted by cancer.

\* Compact discs on many important spiritual topics are available on a rack in the vestibule. The CDs are insightful and practical. Proceeds from the sale of CDs are given to the Outreach Committee to help those who are struggling financially in our area. Take advantage of this opportunity to listen and learn.

\* It is a sad reality that sometimes funeral Masses are poorly attended. Sometimes the decedent has outlived family and friends; sometimes they are not widely known. The Corporal Works of Mercy stress burying the dead. Attending funeral Masses in solidarity with the family and friends of the decedent is praiseworthy and a Corporal Work of Mercy, even if you are not familiar with the decedent.

**IN YOUR PRAYERS** please pray for Ray Sutton, father of Katie Bobby and Msgr. Tim Stein, a priest of our diocese, who died last week. May they rest in peace! May God bless, sustain and console their families and friends.

**ECUMENICAL DIALOGUE.** The Trinity Lutheran Lay School of Theology is presenting an excellent educational opportunity on Sat., May 5, in the Fellowship Hall. The program will present an Ecumenical Dialogue between Lutheran and Roman Catholic theologians discussing the progress made between the two faith traditions. Presenters are Dr. Maria Erling and Msgr. Michael Becker. The book to be used **Declaration on the Way** is available from the Trinity office (445-5446). Registration begins at 8:30AM, program begins at 9AM.

**FR. O'NEILL HEALTH UPDATE.** I have been doing well recently. Side effects have been tolerable. Chemo treatments continue at the UPMC Center in Johnstown. Two weeks ago I went to the Univ. of Penna. Hospital in Philadelphia (home of the NFL Champion Eagles!!) for a consultation. (I took the Penguin license plate cover off my car!) Penn offers treatment options for Multiple Myeloma that UPMC does not. The doctor felt I would be a good candidate for a study that could have very positive results. As for timing: the call could come tomorrow or never. The study could mean a long-term stay in the hospital but if the result offers me the possibility of a longer and more normal life and ministry it has to be followed up. Please keep me in your prayers as the parish is in mine.

**CHOIR CORNER**

**CANTORS NEEDED!** If any parishioner would be interested in learning to cantor for Mass, please call Karen Kuhn at 445-9382. We would like to implement having a cantor at every Mass, and need volunteers if that is going to happen. You can volunteer for this even if you are not in choir. Training will be provided. Time to step up and get involved with your parish.

**THE ANNUAL CATHOLIC MINISTRIES DRIVE** continues. Our assigned parish target is \$58,943. So far 87 parish households have contributed \$46,950. It is obvious that the additional parish goal of \$61,057 to fund hall floor replacement will not be attained. A generous bequest or large gift must appear if this project is to be undertaken. I am very disappointed that only about 12% of our parish households have participated in the drive which funds essential services like Catholic Social Services and its outreach to the poor and struggling. That percentage is unacceptable in a parish rightly noted for its concern and generosity. Perhaps we can play LETS MAKE A DEAL! Two of our church air conditioning units have expired and must be replaced. The estimated cost is \$14,000 for this project. When and if we attain the assigned parish goal (we are \$11,993 short) any additional contributions will be fully returned to the parish. Hall renovation may be unattainable but I believe that air conditioner replacement is both an essential, realistic and attainable goal. Please consider participating in the 2018 Annual Catholic Ministries Appeal.

**THE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL** serves in an advisory role to the pastor in directing the practical and spiritual life of the parish. It is important that new members be brought on to broaden the scope of the Council and bring new ideas and perspectives. Four Council positions have been declared open. Please call the rectory to indicate your intent if you wish to serve on the Pastoral Council. Appointments will be chosen by lot on Pentecost Sunday.
